

Summer Semester 2011 commences May 9, 2011, and Fall Semester commences August 22, 2011. To ensure you will have plenty of time to set up your new home, register for classes, participate in Orientation programs and meet new friends, plan to be on campus and complete your move to Berrien Springs no later than the week prior to your semester start date. We will be happy to assist you with your registration for Summer & Fall Semester. Enclosed is a Summer & Fall Schedule along with the 2011 - 2012 checksheet which lists all the classes you will have to take in order to attain your Master of Divinity.

What's a Checksheet?

A checksheet is a list of classes you will have to take to complete your Master of Divinity program. If you are a Track 1 student you will have to complete 92 credits. If you are a Track 2 student you will have to complete 107 credits. We have enclosed a copy of both checksheets so you can compare the program differences. Please ensure you work off the correct checksheet.

How do I know if I am a Track 1 student or a Track 2 student?

Very easy... If you have an undergraduate degree in Theology or Religion you are a Track 1 student and will have to complete a 92 credit program to attain your Master of Divinity.

If you have an undergraduate degree in any other discipline, you are a Track 2 student and will have to complete a 107 credit program in order to attain your Master of Divinity.

I've been accepted... what now?

- 3. Determine which checksheet you will need. Then using the green Summer semester and orange Fall semester schedules, decide what classes you may like to take. One of the advantages of the Master of Divinity program is you can take up to 16 credits in the Fall and Spring semesters and 12 in the Summer semester in an order of your choosing.
- 4. You will be required to take General Seminary classes, as well as classes from the Christian Ministry, Church History, Old Testament, New Testament, Mission Studies, and Theology departments.

- 5. Read the enclosed Master of Divinity Registration Guide. This will give you an understanding of how the registration process works at Andrews. As a first year student you will be required to register in person with the Master of Divinity Office. Once you have completed 40 credits of your program, you will be free to register yourself online.
- Finalize your move to Berrien
 Springs and set up your new home.
 At Orientation you will be provided a local guide to link you with local services and retailers.

New Student Orientation will take place on Sunday, May 8, 9.00am in the Seminary Chapel.

- 7. Visit the Master of Divinity Office anytime between April 18 and May 6, 2011 to register for your classes. If you are not sure as to what classes you would like to take, we can help you out. Given we have 400 students in our program at present, and over 100 students commencing in the new academic year, we have a lot of people to register. To keep lines a short as possible, please ensure you read the material provided in this pack and have a good idea of what classes you may like to take before you visit the Master of Divinity Office. Don't leave your registration to the last minute as you may miss out on your preferred classes.

8. The Master of Divinity program allows you to undertake an Emphasis in particular areas of

- ministry and scholarship. If you are interested in undertaking an Emphasis, please see the Master of Divinity Office.
- 9. If you would like to pursue a Doctor of Ministry or a Doctor of Philosophy upon completion of your Master of Divinity, please see the Master of Divinity Office. You can take specific classes in your Master of Divinity program which may be used as prerequisites or transfer credits into/for these doctoral programs. You will also be charged Master of Divinity prices for these classes which can be a substantial saving.
- 10. The Master of Divinity program also allows you to undertake a thesis research project. Please see the Master of Divinity Office in your first or second semester if you are interested in writing a thesis. International students are advised that many doctoral programs outside the United States require a Masters level thesis project.



Paying for your Program

We at Andrews recognize that the profession of Ministry is a calling, and as such, offer the Master of Divinity program at a fraction of the price charged for other Masters programs. You will be charged a set registration fee each semester and will be able to take up to 16 credits in the Fall and the Spring, and 12 in the Summer. Each semester you will also pay a General Fee. Moving to Berrien Springs

Moving can be a stressful time, so be sure to allow enough time to move and get settled into your new home. Below are some details which should make your move as stress free as possible.

Family and Graduate Housing

Community Housing

Housing in the community of Berrien Springs is available with rental prices for one bedroom apartments being approximately \$400 -\$500 per month. Larger apartments are about \$500 -\$800 per month and houses can be \$700 - \$1200 per month depending on size and quality. Student Employment

Andrews University is an equal opportunity employer and provides work opportunities for students. Employee Services, which is part of the Office of Human Resources, assists students in their on-campus employment needs. Please be advised that the average rate of pay per hour for student labor is approximately \$9.00. Students desiring part-time employment (up to 20 hours) must be enrolled full-time (9 -16 Master of Divinity credits) be enrolled in a degree-seeking program, and complete the necessary paperwork at Employee Services. The University allows Master of Divinity students to work, as work is available, up to 20 hours per week during the academic year, provided you are undertaking 9 credits or more.

Weather

Berrien Springs experiences four very different seasons. In Spring, the landscape is a carnival of flowering colors. recording fee.


Please see the Seminary Dean's office for the current fee.
